## TRAIT 77.

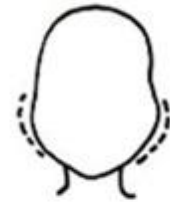
**HIGH STUBBORN — (sharp angle from jaw to chin; indent under cheekbone to corner of mouth)**

Automatically resists; holds on when others try to push him from what he knows is right; counted on to set feet firmly against pressures of surroundings; automatically resists any tone of command or order; an automatic “no” sayer. May appear “mulish” to others.



## TRAIT 78.

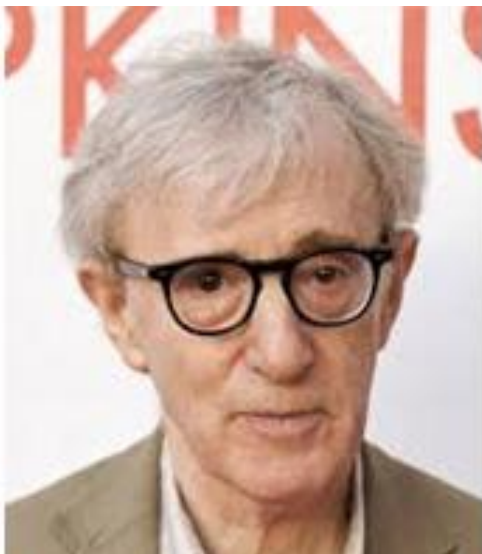
**LOW STUBBORN — (full through cheek area)** More pliable in-the-moment; not as stubborn; good natured; more of an automatic “yes” sayer. May appear to “have no backbone to others.



All traits are valuable even though they express differently. There are not good or bad traits; the force of a fire hose splaying water can be very appropriate at the right time. As in life, there are two sides to everything. For the sake of comparison, high and low is merely the measurement-term used to distinguish the energy force of a trait.
