### TRAIT 9.

**CONSERVING — (roundness at temples)** Conserves and adapts; preserves that which is established; will “make do” and makes use of things; fixes old things up; enjoys home and food. May appear to be a “pack rat” to others.



### TRAIT 10.

**CONSTRUCTIVE — (squareness at temples)** Constructs and builds; likes working with new things; focuses out to new challenges; likes projects. May appear to others at times as “extravagant or wasteful.”



All traits are valuable even though they express differently. There are not good or bad traits; the force of a fire hose splaying water can be very appropriate at the right time. As in life, there are two sides to everything. For the sake of comparison, high and low is merely the measurement-term used to distinguish the energy force of a trait.
